

ARTS AND CRAFTS RULES

Arts and Crafts Vendors must craft with their own hands the products they offer for sale. All new Arts and Crafts Vendors will be subjected to a jury process and will be requested to submit a sample or photo of their work for review. Review considerations are: craftsmanship, quality, aesthetic value, originality and creativity. The Board of Directors may place restrictions on some arts and crafts categories in order to maintain a balanced product mix. If any category of art is determined to be full and that artist has juried in successfully, they can choose to be put on an on call waiting list.

1. All arts and crafts must be made by Lincoln County residents.
2. A vendor is defined as the person who makes the craft. A vendor must be present in their booth if their product is available for sale. Exceptions may be made and will be individually considered by the Market Manager.
3. The product must be the original workmanship of the vendor and must demonstrate quality workmanship and be safe and durable for its intended use.
4. The unauthorized use of copyright design is illegal and will not be allowed at the Market.
5. The vendors work must be predominate and the starting materials must be significantly altered and/or enhanced by the vendor.
6. Artisans may sell, subject to approval, high quality reproductions of their own original work.
7. Soap and body care product vendors must follow federal labeling and ingredient content requirements.
8. Absolutely no reselling is allowed.
9. All new Arts & Crafts applicants, along with current members with new products, must submit photographs or samples of their products.
10. Please list on your application all items you plan to sell at the Market. Items not listed on the original application can be listed on an application amendment and submitted for consideration throughout the market season.
